The Tavelli Spelling Bee Champion for 2022-2023 is Ellie Holmes. Ellie will move on to represent our school at the district level competition.





First Grade News

January is the perfect time to reflect on all the accomplishments we've made so far in first grade. It's also exciting to preview what's in store for the coming months!

We started off the school year by focusing on one of our social studies standards, building a classroom community made up of leaders and team members. One example of student leadership that we often see at recess is first graders initiating friendships when someone is waiting on the buddy bench.

In science, each class was able to use the tower gardens to grow plants with Mrs. Musante. First graders learned about how plants are organisms that change over time as they grow.

One of the most exciting parts about first grade is watching students become readers! During the first few months of school, we learned about and practiced many different phonics patterns in class. We'll continue to work with new phonics skills during the second half of first grade. In addition to phonics, fluency will become one of our main focuses during literacy. We'll make reading fluency goals that we'll work towards each day. As first grade teachers, it's an honor to be able to help build a love for reading in our students!

Being able to work with and manipulate numbers up to 120 is important for first graders. We've learned about different single-digit addition and subtraction strategies, and it will be a fun challenge to extend these strategies when adding and subtracting two-digit numbers in the coming months. Place value is another big focus at this age as well as being able to count on and off-decade by tens.

We can't wait to continue to see amazing social and academic growth in the coming months!

December was a busy month in first grade! From holiday activities to pajama day to sipping hot chocolate, there was plenty of festive fun! One December tradition that we have in first grade is rotating between classrooms so that students can visit each teacher and see other first grade classrooms. This year we spent the last four days before winter break learning about different Arctic animals and making crafts to go along with each animal.

In Mr. Daldegan's class, students learned that walrus tusks never stop growing. Ms. Gomez taught first graders that baby snowy white owls are called owlets. When first graders visited Mrs. Taft's classroom, they read about how caribou are herbivores. Polar bears were the focus in Ms. Vasquez's room where students learned that their white fur is waterproof.

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Tavelli Tiger Training

Tiger Training at Tavelli is an opportunity for the entire school to review and practice our Tavelli Behavior Expectations.
