- Safety concerns: Report through the <u>Safe2Tell website</u> or call 1-877-542-7233.
 - Examples: Threat of harm to others; threat of harm to self; illegal activity.
- Sexual harassment: Report through <u>PSD's Title IX platform</u>.
 Examples: Sexual harassment or discrimination based on sex and/or gender
- Negative experience: Report non-Title IX issues through PSD's Incident Reporting platform.
 - Examples: Discrimination based on culture/ethnicity; bullying; racial or homophobic slander; anti-Semitism

5. Traffic in Front of the School – Just a reminder, please be considerate of our neighbors and refrain from parking in front of driveways. 6. The Playground and Field are Open After School Hours – The playground and field area are for public use after our school day ends at 4:00 p.m. We want to ensure that we get all our students safely home and out of the area. Thanks for your support.

7. A Request From The Health Office – If your child has been out of school due to illness, and has a negative COVID test, we will need a copy of that if your child is returning to school with symptoms. If you have given a home test, please take a picture of the test card with your child's name and the date and time the test was given written on it. *If your student wouldn't have been considered well enough to be at school in pre-COVID days, they aren't well enough to be at school now, even with a negative test result.* Thanks for your continued support.

8. Some Reminders for Parents – If your child is absent from school, please call our attendance line at 488-6726 to let us know your child will be out of school for the day. The office needs daily notification of any absence. In case of extended absences, please let us know when your child will return. If your child will be changing after school dismissal plans, please be sure to give the office a call to explain the change. Breakfast will be served every morning beginning at 8:20, students may arrive on the playground at 8:30, please do not drop your student off to the playground any earlier than that, as there is no supervision before that time. Classes begin at 8:50.

9. Cash for Caps – If you have milk delivered from Morning Fresh Dairy, we can use your clean caps! Morning Fresh will give us 5 cents per cap turned in. There is a collection box for your clean caps available in the Tavelli Office.
